Application for Grant-in-Aid

INTRODUCTION

The Adelpic Educational Fund, Inc. was founded in 1944 by Brother George W. Davison, MID 1892 and Brother Albert W. Johnston, MID 1893 with the intent that the income from the Fund would help students at Wesleyan University who needed financial assistance. Grant recipients are chosen based on their scholarship record, their participation in extracurricular activities, and their contributions in service, leadership and example at Wesleyan. Other alumni Brothers and Sisters of the Fraternity and Society have contributed to the Fund over time. Stewart F. Hancock, MID 1905 was its first President, and William P. Calder, MID 1903 its first Vice President and Treasurer.

The charter of the Adelpic Educational Fund allows grants to be awarded to any undergraduate or graduate student of Wesleyan University, and any such student is invited to apply. In awarding grants-in-aid, the charter also allows the Trustees “to give preference to those students of Wesleyan University who are members of the Middletown Chapter of Alpha Delta Phi.”

Applicants are expected to have an academic average of 85% / B / 3.0 or better for the last completed semester. Applications from Freshmen cannot be considered. The Grants-in-Aid Committee will take into consideration the applicant’s earnings, scholarship aid received from the University and other sources, and fulfillment of financial aid agreements with the University in matters of student loans and summer earnings.

All grants are subject to the discretion of the Grants-in-Aid Committee and are subject to revision at any time by the Committee.

INSTRUCTIONS

All applicants for grants-in-aid are required to submit this form. A typed application is preferred; you may type directly into the form using Adobe Acrobat Reader. You may download Acrobat Reader from Adobe.com. Use supplemental sheets when there is insufficient space on the form.

Applicants seeking the special consideration as members of the Middletown Chapter of the Alpha Delta Phi Society must complete Part II of the form.

Applications should be submitted not later than October 15 of the academic year for which aid is requested. No aid should be requested to meet expenses beyond those for the current academic year at Wesleyan.

A member of the Grants-in-Aid Committee will interview each applicant.
